**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

PURSUANT to the Education Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

**1. Title**—These regulations may be cited as the University Bursaries Regulations 1971, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the University Bursaries Regulations 1971\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

**2. Qualification for fees and allowances bursary**—Regulation 14 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from paragraph (d) of subclause (1) the words “College; or”, and substituting the words “College under the course regulations of the College that were in force in or before the year 1973 for the appropriate Diploma; or”.

**3. Usual period of tenure**—(1) Regulation 23 of the principal regulations (as amended by regulation 3 of the University Bursaries Regulations 1971, Amendment No. 1) is hereby further amended by revoking the proviso, and substituting the following proviso:

“Provided that—

- “(a) A bursary in respect of the course for the degrees of Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery of the University of Otago shall be tenable for a period of not more than 5 years:
- “(b) A bursary in respect of the course for the degrees of Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery of the University of Auckland shall be tenable for a period of not more than 2 years.”

(2) Regulation 3 of the University Bursaries Regulations 1971, Amendment No. 1 is hereby consequentially revoked.

**4. Reduction in period of tenure**—(1) Regulation 25 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclause (1), and substituting the following subclause:

“(1) Where any person awarded a bursary under paragraph (b) or paragraph (d) of subclause (2) of regulation 13 of these regulations, or under subclause (4) or subclause (5) of the said regulation 13, or under paragraph (a) or paragraph (c) or paragraph (e) of subclause (1) of regulation 14 of these regulations, has been granted credits towards or exemptions from his recognised course, the Director-General, having regard to the units or subjects which that person requires in order to complete his recognised course, may reduce the term of the bursary as he thinks fit.”

(2) Regulation 25 of the principal regulations is hereby further amended by adding the following subclause:

“(3) For the purposes of this regulation, the expression “credits towards or exemptions from” includes any credit towards or exemption from a recognised course granted on account of the standard attained in the Entrance Scholarships Examination or the University Bursaries Examination by the person undertaking the course.”

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations amend the University Bursaries Regulations 1971. Regulation 2 of these regulations amends regulation 14 (1) (d) of the principal regulations. The effect of this amendment is to restrict the qualification for a fees and allowances bursary under that paragraph to any person awarded or qualified for the award of the Diploma in Agriculture, or the Diploma in Horticulture, of Lincoln College to those persons who were awarded or were qualified for the award of either of those Diplomas under the course regulations of the College that were in force in or before the year 1973 for the appropriate Diploma.

Regulation 3 of these regulations amends regulation 23 of the principal regulations by providing that a bursary in respect of the course for the degrees of Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery of the University of Otago is to be tenable for a period of not more than 5 years.

Regulation 4 of these regulations amends regulation 25 of the principal regulations to enable a reduction in the period of tenure of a bursary to be made to a bursary awarded under regulation 13 (2) (b), and to a bursary awarded under regulation 14 (1) (a), of the principal regulations. The amendment also makes it clear that a reduction in the period of tenure of any bursary may be made as a result of any credit towards or exemption from a recognised course granted on account of the standard attained in the Entrance Scholarships Examination or the University Bursaries Examination by the person undertaking the course.
