Order in Council

At Wellington this 1st day of September 2003

Present:

Her Excellency the Governor-General in Council

Pursuant to section 2 of the United Nations Act 1946, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting—

- (a) on the advice and with the consent of the Executive Council; and
- (b) for the purpose of giving effect to resolution 1483 (2003) of the Security Council of the United Nations, adopted pursuant to the United Nations Charter on 22 May 2003, calling upon the Government of New Zealand and all other member States of the United Nations to apply in respect of Iraq the measures set out in that resolution,—

makes the following regulations.

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Regulations

1 Title

- (1) These regulations are the United Nations Sanctions (Iraq) Amendment Regulations (No 2) 2003.
- (2) In these regulations, the United Nations Sanctions (Iraq) Regulations 1991¹ are called "the principal regulations".

2 Commencement

These regulations come into force on 3 October 2003.

3 Regulation 17 revoked

The principal regulations are amended by revoking regulation 17.

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 3 October 2003, amend the United Nations Sanctions (Iraq) Regulations 1991 by revoking a provision prohibiting certain transactions relating to assets, money, and securities held in New Zealand by the Government of Iraq. It is unnecessary to keep this provision in force any longer in light of the full implementation (in other regulations) of a recent resolution of the Security Council in relation to Iraq.
