GENERAL ELECTION AND BOUNDARIES) ORDER 1989**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 17th day of July 1989

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 5A of the Area Health Boards Act 1983 (as inserted by section 4 of the Area Health Boards Amendment Act 1989) and to section 5B of the Area Health Boards Act 1983 (as inserted by section 4 of the Area Health Boards Amendment Act (No. 2) 1989) and to subsections (3), (4), and (4A) of section 8 of the Area Health Boards Act 1983 (as amended by section 5 of the Area Health Boards Amendment Act 1989 and by section 5 of the Area Health Boards Amendment Act (No. 2) 1989), and to section 8A of the Area Health Boards Act 1983 (as inserted by section 6 of the Area Health Boards Amendment Act (No. 3) 1988), His Excellency the Governor-General, acting on a recommendation made by the Minister of Health, after consultation by that Minister with the Wellington Area Health Board and the Wairarapa Hospital Board, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Wellington Area Health District (Triennial General Election and Boundaries) Order 1989.

(2) Except as provided in clause 11 (2) of this order, this order shall come into force on the 18th day of July 1989.

2. Abolition of Wellington Area Health District—The Wellington Area Health District is hereby abolished as from the close of the 10th day of December 1989 (being the 57th day after polling day for the next triennial general election of members of local authorities as prescribed by section 4 of the Local Elections and Polls Act 1976).

3. Abolition of Wairarapa Hospital District—The Wairarapa Hospital District is hereby abolished as from the close of the 10th day of December 1989 (being the 57th day after polling day for the next triennial general election of members of local authorities as prescribed by section 4 of the Local Elections and Polls Act 1976).

4. Constitution of Wellington Area Health District—A new area health district, under the name of the Wellington Area Health District, is hereby constituted on the 11th day of December 1989 (being the 58th day after polling day for the next triennial general election of members of local authorities as prescribed by section 4 of the Local Elections and Polls Act 1976).

5. Boundaries for triennial general election—It is hereby declared that, for the purposes of the triennial general election of members of local authorities to be held on the 14th day of October 1989 (as required by section 4 of the Local Elections and Polls Act 1976), the boundaries of the Wellington Area Health District, as constituted by clause 4 of this order, shall be deemed to be the boundaries of the land included within the districts of the territorial authorities specified in the Schedule to this order (including Wellington City but not including the Otaki Ward of the Kapiti Coast District) (all of which territorial authorities are named in the First Schedule to the Local Government Act 1974 (as substituted by clause 2 of the Local Government Act First Schedule Order (No. 2) 1989*)).

6. Boundaries on 58th day after polling day—It is hereby declared that, on the 58th day after polling day for the triennial general elections referred to in clause 5 of this order, the boundaries declared by that clause

shall become the boundaries of the Wellington Area Health District, as constituted by clause 4 of this order.

7. Constituent districts—It is hereby declared that, for the purposes of the triennial general election referred to in clause 5 of this order,—

- (a) The Kapiti Coast District (excluding the Otaki Ward) shall be a constituent district of the Wellington Area Health District; and
- (b) The Porirua City shall be a constituent district of the Wellington Area Health District; and
- (c) The area comprising the wards of Wellington City known as the Tawa Ward, the Northern Ward, the Onslow Ward, and the Western Ward shall be a constituent district of the Wellington Area Health District; and
- (d) The area comprising the wards of Wellington City known as the Lambton Ward, the Southern Ward, and the Eastern Ward shall be a constituent district of the Wellington Area Health District; and
- (e) The Lower Hutt City, the Upper Hutt City, the Masterton District, the Carterton District, and the South Wairarapa District shall each be a constituent district of the Wellington Area Health District.

8. Number of representatives of constituent districts—The number of representatives on the Wellington Area Health Board of each constituent district declared by clause 7 of this order (not being a constituent district to which clause 9 of this order applies) shall be as specified in the Schedule to this order.

9. Combined district—(1) For the purpose of the election of representatives on the Wellington Area Health Board, the Masterton District, the Carterton District, and the South Wairarapa District are hereby combined into a combined district.

(2) The number of members to be elected in common as the representatives of that combined district shall be as specified in the Schedule to this order.

10. Conduct of elections—(1) For the purpose of the conduct of elections held within the constituent district declared by clause 7 (c) of this order,—

- (a) The Wellington City Council (as constituted on the commencement of this clause) is hereby selected and appointed to conduct elections held within that constituent district before the 1st day of November 1989; and
- (b) The Wellington City Council (as constituted by the Local Government (Wellington Region) Reorganisation Order 1989) is hereby selected and appointed to conduct elections held within that constituent district on or after the 1st day of November 1989.

(2) For the purpose of the conduct of elections held within the constituent district declared by clause 7 (d) of this order,—

- (a) The Wellington City Council (as constituted on the commencement of this clause) is hereby selected and appointed to conduct elections held within that constituent district before the 1st day of November 1989; and

(b) The Wellington City Council (as constituted by the Local Government (Wellington Region) Reorganisation Order 1989) is hereby selected and appointed to conduct elections held within that constituent district on or after the 1st day of November 1989.

(3) For the purpose of the conduct of elections held before the 1st day of November 1989 within the combined district created by clause 9 (1) of this order, the Masterton District Council (as constituted on the commencement of this clause) is hereby selected and appointed to be the principal local authority of the combined district.

(4) For the purpose of the conduct of elections held on or after the 1st day of November 1989 within the combined district created by clause 9 (1) of this order, the Masterton District Council (as constituted by the Local Government (Wellington Region) Reorganisation Order 1989) is hereby selected and appointed to be the principal local authority of the combined district.

11. Revocations—(1) Clauses 3 to 5 of, and the Schedule to, the Wellington Area Health District Order 1989* are hereby revoked.

(2) This clause shall come into force on the 11th day of December 1989.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order—

- (a) Abolishes the Wellington Area Health District and the Wairarapa Hospital District as from the close of 10 December 1989; and
- (b) Constitutes on 11 December 1989 a new area health district under the name of the Wellington Area Health District; and
- (c) Declares the boundaries that are to be deemed to be the boundaries of the Wellington Area Health District for the purposes of the triennial general election of members of local authorities to be held on 14 October 1989; and
- (d) Declares the areas that are to be constituent districts of the Wellington Area Health District for the purposes of that election.

On 11 December 1989 (the 58th day after polling day for that election) the boundaries so declared will become the boundaries of the Wellington Area Health District and the constituent districts so declared will become constituent districts of that area health district.

Those boundaries include part of the Wairarapa Hospital District. The other part of that Hospital District is being included, as from the close of 10 December 1989, in the Manawatu-Wanganui Area Health District.

Three constituent districts are combined into a combined district for the purpose of the election of representatives on the area health board.

At the triennial general election to be held on 14 October 1989, no election will take place in relation to the Wellington Area Health Board or the Wairarapa Hospital Board (the Boards of the districts to be abolished). The representatives of those Boards at the close of the day before polling day will continue to hold office until the close of 10 December 1989.
