PURSUANT to sections 56BB and 100A of the Judicature Act 1908, section 212 (2) (c) of the Summary Proceedings Act 1957, section 410 (2) (c) of the Crimes Act 1961, and to section 113 (1) (k) of the Public Finance Act 1977 (so far as these regulations relate to witnesses and interpreters paid by the Crown under regulation 4 of the Witnesses and Interpreters Fees Regulations 1974), His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Witnesses and Interpreters Fees Regulations 1974, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Witnesses and Interpreters Fees Regulations 1974* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 13th day of October 1986.
- 2. Certain witnesses' fees reduced—Clause 3 of the Schedule to the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 2 (1) of the Witnesses and Interpreters Fees Regulations 1974, Amendment No. 2) is hereby amended—
 - (a) By omitting in relation to paragraph (a) the expression "16", and substituting the expression "12.50":
 - (b) By omitting in relation to paragraph (b) the expression "32", and substituting the expression "25".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 13 October 1986, reduce the fees payable to witnesses (other than expert witnesses). As from that date, withholding tax will no longer be deducted from such fees.
