

THE WEIGHTS AND MEASURES (MILK PACKAGING) **NOTICE 1986**

PURSUANT to section 39 (3A) of the Weights and Measures Act 1925, the Minister of Labour hereby gives the following notice.

NOTICE

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This notice may be cited as the Weights and Measures (Milk Packaging) Notice 1986.
 - (2) This notice shall come into force on the 1st day of October 1986.
- 2. Standard metric packages for milk—It is hereby declared that, notwithstanding anything in regulation 3 of the Metrication (Retail Trading) Regulations 1978*, milk (as defined in section 2 of the Milk Act 1967) may be sold by retail if it is enclosed in a package of one of the following metric net measures:

150 ml, 250 ml, 300 ml, 500 ml, 600 ml, 1 litre, 1.5 litres, or 2 litres.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This notice, which is to come into force on 1 October 1986, provides that, notwithstanding anything in regulation 3 of the Metrication (Retail Trading) Regulations 1978, milk may be sold by retail if it is enclosed in a package of one of the metric net measures specified in the notice. The effect of the notice is that, beginning on that date, milk may be sold by retail in a much wider range of standard metric package sizes.

The term "milk" means, in this notice, "milk" as defined in section 2 of the Milk Act 1967. As so defined that term includes, among other things, cream.
