HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Weights and Measures Act 1987, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Weights and Measures Regulations 1987, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Weights and Measures Regulations 1987* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 28th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Weights, measures, etc., approved by overseas weights and measures authority—The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 4, the following regulation:

"4A. (1) In this regulation, 'overseas weights and measures authority' means a weights and measures authority of a country that is a full member of the International Organisation of Legal Metrology (O.I.M.L.).

"(2) Where the Chief Inspector is satisfied that the type, material, and design of any weight, measure, or weighing or measuring instrument in respect of which an application is made under regulation 3(1) of these regulations have been approved by an overseas weights and measures authority, the type, material, and design of that weight, measure, or weighing or measuring instrument shall be deemed to satisfy the requirements set out in paragraphs (a) to (c) of regulation 4(1) of these regulations, and the Chief Inspector shall approve that type of weight, measure, or weighing or measuring instrument under regulation 4(1) of these regulations without the need for further inquiry or testing.

"(3) For the purposes of subclause (2) of this regulation, the fact that a weight, measure, or weighing or measuring instrument bears a mark of approval from an overseas weights and measures authority is sufficient evidence that the type, material, and design of that weight, measure, or weighing or measuring instrument have been approved by that authority."

3. Fees inclusive of goods and services tax—The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 15, the following regulation:

"15A. The fees specified in the First Schedule to these regulations are inclusive of goods and services tax under the Goods and Services Tax Act 1985."

4. New scale of fees substituted—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the First Schedule, and substituting the First Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations. Reg. 4

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Weights and Measures Regulations 1987.

Regulation 2 inserts a new regulation 4_A into the principal regulations. The new regulation provides for a special procedure for the approval of new weights, measures, and weighing or measuring instruments that have been approved by a weights and measures authority of a country that is a full member of the International Organisation of Legal Metrology (O.I.M.L.). Where the Chief Inspector of Weights and Measures is satisfied that such an approval has been given, the weight, measure, or weighing or measuring instrument is to be approved without the need for further inquiry or testing. A special reduced fee is also prescribed in respect of applications for approvals in such circumstances.

These regulations also increase the fees prescribed for various matters under the principal regulations. The increases reflect the fact that all of the fees now include goods and services tax, and do not represent an actual increase in the fee payable.

Regulation 3 inserts a new regulation 15_A into the principal regulations. The new regulation makes it clear that all the fees prescribed by the principal regulations are inclusive of goods and services tax.
