**THE WORKERS' COMPENSATION ORDER 1969,  
AMENDMENT NO. 2**

PURSUANT to the Workers' Compensation Act 1956, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

**O R D E R**

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) This order may be cited as the Workers' Compensation Order 1969, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Workers' Compensation Order 1969\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal order).

(2) This order shall come into force on the 7th day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

(3) Clauses 2 and 3 of this order shall apply in respect of compensation payable after the commencement of this order for any period after the commencement of this order in respect of accidents happening before or after the commencement of this order.

**2. Compensation for total incapacity**—Clause 3 of the principal order is hereby amended by omitting from paragraph (b) of subclause (1) the expression "\$25.00", and substituting the expression "\$32".

**3. Compensation for partial incapacity**—Clause 4 of the principal order is hereby amended by omitting the expression "\$25.00", and substituting the expression "\$32".

**4. Medical expenses**—Clause 8 of the principal order (as substituted by clause 2 of the Workers' Compensation Order 1969, Amendment No. 1) is hereby amended by omitting from paragraph (b) of subclause (1) the word "visit" in both places where it occurs, and substituting in each case the word "attendance".

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

Clauses 2 and 3 increase the maximum weekly payments for total and partial incapacity from \$25 to \$32.

Clause 4 makes it clear that the additional medical fee chargeable in respect of weekends, public holidays, and night time, are payable for attendance to a patient in the surgery as well as for a visit to a patient.
