THE WINE DUTY (SOUTH AFRICA) ORDER 1938.

GALWAY, Governor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 26th day of February, 1938.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the Governor-General is satisfied that the duty prescribed by an Order in Council dated the 7th day of September, 1925, and published in the *Gazette* of the 10th day of the same month, in respect of wine, other than sparkling, produced in the Union of South Africa, is likely to operate in an injurious manner in respect of the wine-producing industry in New Zealand, and it is accordingly desirable that he should, to the extent hereinafter specified, exercise the powers conferred on him by section 12 of the Customs Amendment Act, 1921:

Now, therefore, pursuant to the powers conferred on him by the said section, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Wine Duty (South Africa) Order 1938.

2. This Order shall come into force on the 1st day of March, 1938.

3. The hereinbefore-recited Order in Council of the 7th day of September, 1925, is hereby amended by omitting from the Schedule thereto the rate of duty prescribed in respect of wine, other than sparkling, and substituting therefor the rate of five shillings and sixpence the gallon.

4. Nothing in the proviso to the said Order in Council shall apply with respect to the rate of duty prescribed by this Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be read subject to the provisions of section 143 of the Customs Act, 1913.
