

## THE WHITEBAIT FISHING REGULATIONS 1964, AMENDMENT NO. 4

### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Fisheries Act 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Whitebait Fishing Regulations 1964, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Whitebait Fishing Regulations 1964\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of December 1968, and shall continue in force until the 21st day of that month and shall then expire with that date and thereupon be deemed to be revoked.
- 2. Close season for whitebait—While these regulations continue in force, regulation 4 of the principal regulations shall be read as if there were added to paragraph (b) of subclause (1) the following proviso:

"Provided that nothing in this Part of these regulations except regulation 7 shall apply in respect of the Wairau River and the Hurunui River (including their tributaries) and all those rivers and streams lying between the Wairau River and the Hurunui River."

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations extend the open season for taking etc. whitebait from the Wairau River and Hurunui River, and those rivers and streams lying between the Wairau River and the Hurunui River, until 21 December 1968.
