PURSUANT to the Economic Stabilisation Act 1948, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Wage Freeze Regulations 1982, Amendment No. 32, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Wage Freeze Regulations 1982* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 16th day of October 1984.

2. Fourth Schedule amended—The Fourth Schedule to the principal regulations (as added by regulation 9 of the Wage Freeze Regulations 1982, Amendment No. 2) is hereby amended by adding, after clause 145 (as added by regulation 4 (2) of the Wage Freeze Regulations 1982, Amendment No. 31), the following clause:

"146. An instrument entered into with the Otago Harbour Board to prescribe conditions of employment for waterside workers employed to work ABC Container Line non-cellular container vessels at Port Chalmers."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 16 October 1984, vary the wage freeze.

Regulation 2 provides for a further exemption under regulation 6A of the principal regulations. To be exempt under that regulation an instrument must implement a complete settlement and be an instrument which—

- (a) Is made after the commencement of the principal regulations on 23 June 1982; and
- (b) Is specified in the Fourth Schedule to the principal regulations (as amended by these regulations); and
- (c) Contains terms relating to remuneration, or to both remuneration and reimbursing payments, all of which, after having been referred to the Wage Freeze Authority on the application of the parties, or, if there are not two or more parties, on the application of the employer, have been approved by it.
