**THE WAIPOUA FOREST SANCTUARY ADVISORY
COMMITTEE REGULATIONS 1952**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 27th day of August 1952

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL
PURSUANT to the Forests Act 1949, His Excellency the Administrator of
the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the
Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Waipoua Forest
Sanctuary Advisory Committee Regulations 1952.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the
date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—
“Committee” means the Waipoua Forest Sanctuary Advisory
Committee:

“Minister” means the Minister of Forests.

3. There shall be an advisory committee, which shall be known as the
Waipoua Forest Sanctuary Advisory Committee.

4. (1) The Committee shall consist of—

(a) The Member of Parliament for the Hobson Electorate, who shall
be the Chairman of the Committee:

(b) The Conservator of Forests, Auckland, who shall be the Deputy
Chairman of the Committee:

(c) One person to be appointed by the Minister of Forests to
represent the Hokianga County Council:

(d) One person to be appointed by the Minister to represent the
Hobson County Council:

(e) One person to be appointed by the Minister to represent the
Auckland Institute and Museum:

(f) One person to be appointed by the Minister to represent the
Waipoua Preservation Society (Incorporated):

(g) One person to be appointed by the Minister to represent the
Forest and Bird Protection Society of New Zealand
Incorporated.

(2) The Minister shall appoint the representatives mentioned in paragraphs (c), (d), (e), (f), and (g) of subclause (1) of this regulation from a panel nominated by each of the organizations to be represented.

(3) The powers of the Committee shall not be affected by any vacancy in the membership thereof.

5. All persons appointed by the Minister to the Committee shall, subject to these regulations, be appointed for a period of three years, and shall be eligible for reappointment.

6. The office of an appointed member of the Committee shall become vacant, and the vacancy shall be deemed to be a casual vacancy, if the member—

(a) Resigns his office by writing under his hand delivered to the Chairman of the Committee; or

(b) Dies or becomes of unsound mind.

7. Every casual vacancy shall be filled by the appointment by the Minister, in accordance with subclause (2) of regulation 4 hereof, of some fit person to the Committee for the residue of the term of the retiring member.

8. The Committee shall meet at such places and at such times as the Chairman may appoint from time to time.

9. The Chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Committee at which he is present. If at any meeting of the Committee the Chairman for the time being is not present or there is no Chairman, the Deputy Chairman shall preside at the meeting; and if the Deputy Chairman also is not present at the meeting or there is no Deputy Chairman, the Committee shall appoint some member present to act as Chairman in respect of that meeting. The Deputy Chairman or person so appointed shall have and may exercise in any such case all the powers and functions of the Chairman for the purposes of the meeting.

10. If any member of the Committee is unable to attend any meeting of the Committee he may, by writing under his hand or by telephone or telegram to the Chairman of the Committee, appoint any person to attend the meeting in his stead, and that person while so attending shall be deemed to be a member of the Committee.

11. Subject to the provisions of these regulations, the Committee may make such arrangements as it thinks fit for the holding of its meetings, the procedure thereat, and generally for the conduct of its business and the exercise of its functions.

12. At all meetings of the Committee a majority of the members shall form a quorum, and no business shall be transacted at any meeting unless a quorum is present.

Functions

13. The functions of the Committee shall be to advise the Minister in respect of measures to be taken in the control and preservation of the area of State forest land known as the Waipoua Forest Sanctuary which was set apart as a forest sanctuary by a Proclamation dated the 2nd day of July 1952 and published in *Gazette* No. 45 on the 3rd day of that month at page 1134.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations provide for the setting up of an advisory committee to advise the Minister of Forests in respect of measures to be taken in the control and preservation of the Waipoua Forest Sanctuary.
