THE WILDLIFE (CANADA GOOSE) ORDER 1958

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 3rd day of June 1958

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. W. NASH PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Wildlife Act 1953, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. This order may be cited as the Wildlife (Canada Goose) Order 1958.

2. It is hereby declared that Canada goose (*Branta canadensis*) shall be game in the following areas in addition to the area specified in the First Schedule to the Wildlife Act 1953, namely:

- (a) The area of land and water comprising the Waitaki River (including Lake Waitaki) from its confluence with the Ahuriri River to the sea, the bed of that portion of the Waitaki River and all islands in that portion, and a strip of land 100 yards wide around the margin for the time being of Lake Waitaki:
- (b) That portion of the Waimate Acclimatisation District that lies to the eastward of the South Island Main Trunk Railway line.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

The effect of this order is that, in addition to the existing area where it is already game, Canada goose will be game in the Waitaki River (including Lake Waitaki) from its confluence with the Ahuriri River to the sea, and also in that portion of the Waimate Acclimatisation District that lies to the eastward of the South Island Main Trunk Railway line.
