THE WILDLIFE (CANADA GOOSE) ORDER 1966

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 14th day of March 1966

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. KEITH HOLYOAKE, C.H., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Wildlife Act 1953, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. This order may be cited as the Wildlife (Canada Goose) Order 1966.

2. It is hereby declared that Canada goose (*Branta canadensis*) shall be game in the following areas in addition to the area specified in the First Schedule to the Wildlife Act 1953, namely:

- (a) That area of land and water comprising the Waitaki River (including Lake Waitaki) from the Benmore Dam to the sea, the bed of that portion of the Waitaki River and all islands in that portion, and a strip of land 100 yards wide around the margin for the time being of Lake Waitaki:
- (b) That portion of the Waimate Acclimatisation District that lies to the eastward of the South Island Main Trunk Railway line:
- (c) That portion of the Waitaki Acclimatisation District that lies to the eastward of Otematata River and Blue Duck Creek.

3. The Wildlife (Canada Goose) Order 1958* is hereby revoked.
