PURSUANT to sections 6 and 232 of the Harbours Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Westport Harbour Regulations 1982, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Westport Harbour Regulations 1982\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

**2. Berthage charges**—The First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from the third column the item relating to berthage charges for fishing vessels under regulation 35 (1) of the principal regulations, and substituting the following item:

“Either—

(a) \$27.00 per metre or part metre of the overall length of the vessel per year; or

(b) \$0.37 per metre or part metre of the overall length of the vessel per day—  
at the option of the owner of the vessel.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

The effect of these regulations is to increase berthage charges for fishing vessels at Westport Harbour from \$18 to \$27 per year for each metre of overall length of the vessel, and from 25 cents to 37 cents per day for each metre of overall length of the vessel. Whether the charges are paid on an annual or daily basis is at the option of the owner of the vessel.
