**THE WINE MAKERS LICENSING REGULATIONS 1954,  
AMENDMENT NO. 1**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government House at Wellington this 11th day of April 1956

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Licensing Act 1908, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

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**REGULATIONS**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Wine Makers Licensing Regulations 1954, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Wine Makers Licensing Regulations 1954\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. The First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking forms 2 and 4, and substituting the new forms 2 and 4 set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

## GRAPE WINE LICENCE

In the Magistrate's Court at.....

I HEREBY authorise A.B., of ....., subject to the provisions of the Licensing Act 1908, to manufacture on his premises at....., during the currency of this licence, a total quantity not exceeding .....gallons of grape wine, including wine manufactured by any other holder of a grape wine licence and blended with wine manufactured by the said A.B.: and the said A.B. is hereby authorised to sell wine manufactured or blended by him pursuant to the Licensing Act 1908, being wine of a strength not exceeding 40 per cent of proof spirit, in the following quantities:

- (a) In the case of wine containing not more than 25 parts per cent of proof spirit, in quantities of not less than one reputed quart to any one person at any one time:
- (b) In the case of wine containing more than 25 parts per cent of proof spirit, in quantities of not less than two gallons to any one person at any one time:
- (c) In any case where wine containing more than 25 parts per cent of proof spirit is sold together with wine containing not more than 25 parts per cent of proof spirit, in quantities of not less, in the aggregate, than two gallons to any one person at any one time:

Provided that this licence, while it continues in force, is subject to the proviso to section 23 (1) of the Licensing Amendment Act (No. 2) 1953 (as substituted by section 21 of the Licensing Amendment Act 1955), the effect of which is that in any case to which paragraph (b) or paragraph (c) (above) applies, until the end of December 1957, the minimum quantity that may be sold to any one person at any one time is half a gallon.

All wine sold pursuant to this licence is to be delivered from the premises at .....only.

FRUIT WINE LICENCE

In the Magistrate's Court at.....

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations prescribe new forms of wine makers' licences. The new forms of licences follow section 21 of the Licensing Amendment Act 1955, which alters the law relating to the minimum quantities of different kinds of wines that may be sold under such licences.

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Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act 1936.

Date of notification in *Gazette*: 12 April 1956.

These regulations are administered in the Department of Justice.
