**THE WINE MAKERS LICENSING REGULATIONS 1954,  
AMENDMENT NO. 2**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 10th day of April 1961

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. KEITH HOLYOAKE, PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Licensing Act 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Wine Makers Licensing Regulations 1954, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Wine Makers Licensing Regulations 1954\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. (1) The First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking forms 2 and 4, as substituted by regulation 2 of the Wine Makers Licensing Regulations 1954, Amendment No. 1, and substituting the new forms 2 and 4 set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) The Wine Makers Licensing Regulations 1954, Amendment No. 1, are hereby revoked.

**GRAPE WINE LICENCE**

## FRUIT WINE LICENCE

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations prescribe new forms of wine makers' licences. The new forms of licences follow section 6 of the Licensing Amendment Act 1960, which now permits sales under wine makers' licences in quantities of not less than one reputed quart at any one time.
