

# THE WOODWORKING MACHINERY REGULATIONS 1973. AMENDMENT NO. 1

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 5th day of April 1982

#### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Machinery Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Woodworking Machinery Regulations 1973, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Woodworking Machinery Regulations 1973\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 14th day after the date of their notification in the Gazette.
- **2. Offences**—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 71, and substituting the following regulation:

"71. (1) Every person commits an offence against these regulations who-

- "(a) Fails or neglects to do anything that he is required by regulation 69 or regulation 70 of these regulations to do; or
- "(b) Without lawful excuse, obstructs, impedes, or interferes with the doing of anything required by these regulations to be done; or
- "(c) Does, or causes or permits to be done, any act in contravention of regulation 69 or regulation 70 of these regulations.
- "(2) Every offence under these regulations shall be triable summarily."
- (2) Regulation 72 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked.

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, out is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Woodworking Machinery Regulations 1973 to make clear that owners of machinery who are in breach of the regulations are to be charged with offences under the Machinery Act 1950 and, by revoking regulation 72, to increase the maximum penalties for breaches of the regulations by persons of any class from up to \$500 (and up to \$20 per day in respect of continuing offences) to up to \$2,000 (and up to \$100 per day in respect of continuing offences).
