THE WILDLIFE (PEAFOWL) ORDER 1960

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 21st day of December 1960

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Wildlife Act 1953, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. This order may be cited as the Wildlife (Peafowl) Order 1960.
2. It is hereby declared that peafowl (*Pavo cristatus*) shall cease to be included in the Fifth Schedule to the Wildlife Act 1953, and shall henceforth be included in the Third Schedule to that Act, and those Schedules shall hereafter be read accordingly.
3. This order shall have effect throughout New Zealand.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

The effect of this order is that peafowl, which at present is unprotected, may in future be hunted or killed subject to Minister's notification.
