ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 27th day of October 1970

PURSUANT to the Wildlife Act 1953, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Wildlife Order (No. 2) 1970.
- (2) This order shall come into force on the seventh day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.
 - 2. Application—This order shall have effect throughout New Zealand.
- 3. Unprotected wildlife—It is hereby declared that the guinea fowl (Numida) shall cease to be included in the First Schedule to the Wildlife Act 1953 and shall be included in the Fifth Schedule to that Act, and those Schedules shall hereafter be read accordingly.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

The effect of this order is that the guinea fowl is transferred from the First Schedule to the Fifth Schedule, and will therefore be unprotected.
