ORDER IN COUNCIL

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the War Pensions Act 1954, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the War Pensions Regulations 1956, Amendment No. 27, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the War Pensions Regulations 1956* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of October 1987.

2. Increasing amounts of war bursaries—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Sixth Schedule (as substituted by regulation 5 (1) of the War Pensions Regulations 1956,

(2) Regulation 5 of, and the First Schedule to, the War Pensions Regulations 1956, Amendment No. 26 are hereby consequentially revoked.

3. Increasing allowances and annuities payable to holders of decorations—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Tenth and Eleventh Schedules (as substituted by regulation 7 (1) of the War Pensions Regulations 1956, Amendment No. 26), and substituting the Tenth and Eleventh Schedules set out in the Second Schedule to these regulations.

(2) Regulation 7 of, and the Third Schedule to, the War Pensions Regulations 1956, Amendment No. 26, are hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

Regulation 2 increases, on and after 1 October 1987, the rates of war bursaries payable to secondary school children, technical institute students, teachers college students, and university students.

Regulation 3 increases, on and after 1 October 1987, the allowances payable to holders of certain specified decorations who are in receipt of a disablement pension. The allowance is increased from \$5.77 to \$6.83 a week.

In addition, the annuity payable to holders of the Victoria Cross is increased, on and after 1 October 1987, from \$1,155 to \$1,366.
