

## THE WAR PENSIONS REGULATIONS 1956, AMENDMENT NO. 87

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 11th day of March 1996

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the War Pensions Act 1954, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the War Pensions Regulations 1956, Amendment No. 37, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the War Pensions Regulations 1956\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1996.
- 2. Increasing travelling allowances—Regulation 44 of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 5(1) of the War Pensions Regulations 1956, Amendment No. 25 and amended by regulation 2 of the War Pensions Regulations 1956, Amendment No. 36) is hereby amended by omitting the expression "\$16.55", and substituting the expression "\$17.03".
- **3.** Increasing amounts of war bursaries—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Sixth Schedule (as substituted by regulation 3 of the War Pensions Regulations 1956, Amendment No. 36), and substituting the Sixth Schedule set out in the First Schedule to these regulations.
- 4. Increasing amounts of motor vehicle loans—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Eighth Schedule (as substituted by regulation 4 of the War Pensions Regulations 1956, Amendment No. 36), and substituting the Eighth Schedule set out in the Second Schedule to these regulations.
- 5. Increasing allowances and annuities payable to holders of decorations—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Tenth and Eleventh Schedules (as substituted by regulation 5 of the War Pensions Regulations 1956, Amendment No. 36), and substituting the Tenth and Eleventh Schedules set out in the Third Schedule to these regulations.
- **6. Consequential revocation**—The War Pensions Regulations 1956, Amendment No. 36 are hereby consequentially revoked.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 April 1996, amend the War Pensions Regulations 1956.

Regulation 2 increases, on and after 1 April 1996, the rate of travelling allowance from \$16.55 to \$17.03 a week.

Regulation 3 increases, on and after 1 April 1996, the rates of war bursaries payable to secondary school students and students of colleges of education, polytechnics, universities, and wananga.

Regulation 4 increases, on and after 1 April 1996, the maximum amounts of motor vehicle loans available for the purchase of motor vehicles. The maximum amount of loan available for double amputees and paraplegics is increased from \$12,305.16 to \$12,664.47. The maximum amount of loan available for war pensioners with a permanent locomotive disability is increased from \$5,537.68 to \$5,699.38.

Regulation 5 increases, on and after 1 April 1996, the allowances payable to holders of certain specified decorations who are in receipt of a disablement pension. The allowance is increased from \$7.21 to \$7.42 a week.

In addition, the annuity payable to holders of the Victoria Cross is increased, on and after 1 April 1996, from \$1,442.55 to \$1,484.67.

Regulation 6 is a consequential revocation.
