**THE WAR PENSIONS REGULATIONS 1956,
AMENDMENT NO. 4**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 11th day of July 1962

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the War Pensions Act 1954, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the War Pensions Regulations 1956, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the War Pensions Regulations 1956* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by repealing the Second Schedule and also the Fifth Schedule (as amended by regulation 3 of the War Pensions Regulations 1956, Amendment No. 2), and substituting the Second and Fifth Schedules set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) Regulation 3 of the War Pensions Regulations 1956, Amendment No 2, is hereby revoked.

In this Schedule the term 'public holiday' means Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, the 2nd day of January, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Labour Day, and the holiday observed in the locality concerned as Anniversary Day; and includes, when any of the above-named public holidays (other than Anzac Day) that can fall on a Saturday or a Sunday so falls, the day that is observed in the locality concerned as a substituted public holiday.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations make the following changes in the principal regulations:

- (a) The Second Schedule (relating to fees for medical examination) is replaced, the principal changes being an increase in the fees payable for consultations in surgery and for visits to patients. There is an increase in fees payable for visits on Sundays or public holidays.
- (b) The Fifth Schedule (relating to allowances in respect of meals and accommodation and loss of earnings) is replaced, the allowance for meals and accommodation being increased by 5s. a day, and the allowance for loss of earnings being increased by 2s. 6d. a day.
