ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 13th day of December 1971

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Wildlife Act 1953, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title—These regulations may be cited as the Wildlife Regulations 1955, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Wildlife Regulations 1955* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Artificial decoys—Regulation 18 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from subclause (3) the words “shall prevent them from spreading over an area greater than 30 yards square and”.

3. Freezing chambers and canneries—(1) The principal regulations are hereby further amended by revoking Part IV.

(2) Regulation 4 of the Wildlife Regulations 1955, Amendment No. 2, is hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

Regulation 2 amends regulation 18 (3) of the principal regulations restricting the spread of decoys by omitting the provisions that they must be prevented from spreading over an area greater than 30 yards square.

Regulation 3 revokes Part IV of the principal regulations relating to the keeping of game in freezing chambers.
