THE WATERFRONT STRIKE NOTICE 1951

PURSUANT to the Waterfront Strike Emergency Regulations 1951,* the Minister of Labour, being satisfied that the strike now existing in the waterfront industry has caused and is likely to cause serious loss and inconvenience and that it has been brought about by members of the New Zealand Waterside Workers' Industrial Union of Workers, hereby gives notice as follows.

NOTICE

- 1. This notice may be cited as the Waterfront Strike Notice 1951.
- 2. In this notice, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 - "Strike" means the strike now existing in the waterfront industry, being the act of members of the union in discontinuing their employment by refusing or failing to work normal hours, including overtime as required in accordance with the conditions of their employment:
 - "Union" means the New Zealand Waterside Workers' Industrial Union of Workers.
- 3. The union is hereby required to end the strike not later than 8 a.m. on Monday, the 26th day of February, 1951.
- 4. If the strike is not ended at or before the time specified in clause 3 hereof, it shall from that time be a strike to which the Waterfront Strike Regulations 1951* apply.
