**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government House at Wellington, this 24th day of  
August, 1949

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Samoa Act, 1921, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

---

**REGULATIONS**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Western Samoa Stamp-Demonetization Regulations 1949.
  2. Every instrument that is dated after the 31st day of December, 1949, and is stamped with any of the stamps referred to in the Schedule hereto, and every postal packet that is posted after that date and is so stamped, shall be deemed to be not duly stamped.
  3. Every person who has in his possession any of the said stamps may at any time within twelve months after the said date present the stamps at any post-office in Western Samoa or at the General Post Office, Wellington, New Zealand, and thereupon the stamps shall be exchanged for current stamps of an equal face value.
