**THE ZINC CONTROL NOTICE 1941.**

PURSUANT to the powers vested in me by Regulation 5 of the Factory Emergency Regulations 1939, I, George Augustus Pascoe, Factory Controller, hereby give notice and direct as follows:—

1. This notice may be cited as the Zinc Control Notice 1941.

2. On and after the date of publication of this notice zinc shall not be used by the occupier of a factory, or the owner of factory materials, for the following purposes without the express approval of the Factory Controller:—

- (a) Galvanizing steel transmission-line towers (cross-arms excepted):
- (b) Galvanizing steel structures for electricity substations:
- (c) Galvanizing transmission-line hardware, including U-bolts, engineers' and coach bolts, pole-stays, and brackets (insulating-pins and transmission and strain clamps, also straps and bolts for shackle insulators only excepted):
- (d) Galvanizing switch and fuse bases:
- (e) Galvanizing guy wires and rods:
- (f) Galvanizing cast-iron flushing-cisterns:
- (g) The manufacture of brass castings or sheet for decorative and furnishing metalwork—examples, toilet fixtures, towel-rails, coat-hooks, door furniture, and hearth furniture:
- (h) The manufacture of zinc or zinc alloy castings produced in die-casting equipment.
