AN ORDINANCE *to amend an Ordinance "to divide the Province of Otago into New Electoral Districts, for the Election of Members of the Provincial Council."* Title.

WHEREAS in the description of the Matau and Manuherikia Districts respectively set forth in the Schedule to the "Otago Representation Ordinance 1862" one of the boundaries of each of the said Districts is stated to be the "*North Tokomairiro District*" whereas no such District in fact exists and it is therefore expedient to amend the said Ordinance : Preamble

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Superintendent of the Province of Otago with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof as follows :—

1. The Short Title of this Ordinance shall be the "*Otago Representation Ordinance 1862 Amendment Ordinance.*" Short Title

2. The words "*North Tokomairiro District*" in the descriptions of the Matau and Manuherikia Districts respectively set forth in Interpretation Clause.

the Schedule to the "Otago Representation Ordinance 1862" shall be held and taken to mean the "Tokomairiro District" as in the said Schedule described.
