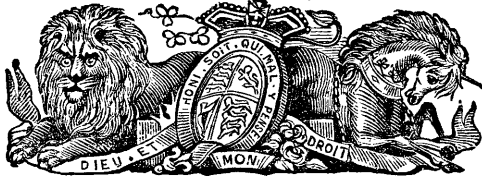

SUNDAY OBSERVANCE ORDINANCE, 1862.

IN THE TWENTY-SIXTH YEAR OF THE REIGN OF HER MAJESTY
QUEEN VICTORIA.

ANALYSIS.

Preamble

AN ORDINANCE *for securing the better Observance of the
Lord's Day.*

WHEREAS it is expedient to discourage trading on Sunday Preamble
and other practices inconsistent with the observance of
the day :—

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Superintendent of Otago
with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof as
follows :

1. Any person who shall trade deal transact business or expose Penalty for trading on
Sunday
goods or who shall keep open any house store shop bar or other
place (except as hereinafter provided) for the purpose of trading
dealing transacting business or exposing goods on Sunday shall on
conviction forfeit a penalty of not more than ten pounds: Provided
that nothing herein contained shall be construed to extend to
Apothecaries or to prohibit the keepers of Inns and Hotels duly
licensed from selling on Sunday victuals and liquors to persons
being *bona fide* travellers or lodgers or inmates of such Inns and
Hotels respectively.

2. Any person found shooting for pleasure or profit of any kind Penalty for sporting or
playing at games
or sporting with a dog or gun or playing at any game or pastime
in any public place on Sunday shall forfeit and pay a penalty for
very such offence of not more than ten pounds.

Recovery of penalties

3. All proceedings under this Ordinance may be had or taken and all fines and penalties recovered in a summary way.

Laws repealed repugnant to this Ordinance

4. All laws acts and Ordinances now in force within the Province of Otago repugnant to the provisions of this Ordinance shall be and are hereby repealed in so far as the same are repugnant hereto.

Short Title.

5. This Ordinance shall be termed and may be cited and referred to as the "Sunday Observance Ordinance 1862."

Passed the Provincial Council this eight day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two.
