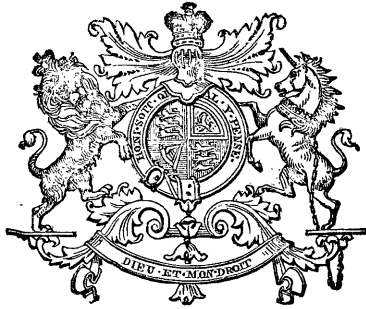

TRIGONOMETRICAL STATION ORDINANCE, 1861-2.

IN THE TWENTY-FIFTH YEAR OF THE REIGN OF HER MAJESTY

QUEEN VICTORIA.

AN ORDINANCE *to amend an Ordinance intituled "An Ordinance to provide for the security and preservation of Trigonometrical Stations and Boundary and Survey Marks in the Province of Otago."*

WHEREAS an Ordinance was passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago in the twenty-fifth year of the reign of Her present Majesty intituled "An Ordinance to provide for the security and preservation of Trigonometrical Stations and Boundary and Survey Marks in the Province of Otago": And whereas no proceedings have yet been taken for

carrying out the provisions of the said Ordinance and it is expedient that a right of appeal should be given to the owners of land to which the provisions of the said Ordinance are applicable :

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Superintendent of the Province of Otago by and with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof as follows:—

Appeal.

1. In every case in which a tender of five pounds shall be made to the owner of any land on which any Trigonometrical Station is or as been situate for the purchase of the site of any such station and right of way thereto either personally or by such notice as is prescribed by the said Ordinance every such owner who shall feel himself aggrieved thereby shall be entitled to appeal to the Supreme Court on the ground of the insufficiency of the sum of five pounds as compensation for the site of such station and right of way thereto : Provided he shall within three calendar months after the making of such tender or publication of such notice as aforesaid give to the Superintendent notice in writing of such appeal and the matter and grounds thereof and shall execute a bond to the Registrar of the said Court conditioned to appear and try such appeal and abide the judgment of the Court thereon.

Offences to be charged as knowingly and wilfully committed.

2. In every information or other proceeding charging any person with the commission of any act prohibited by clause 4 of the said recited Ordinance such person shall be charged with having knowingly and wilfully committed such act: and no person shall be adjudged guilty of any act prohibited by the said clause unless it be proved that he knowingly and wilfully committed such act.

Trigonometrical Station Ordinance 1861 and this Ordinance to be one Ordinance.

3. This Ordinance and the Trigonometrical Station Ordinance 1861 shall be taken to be and construed as one Ordinance and shall have the short title of "The Trigonometrical Station Ordinance 1861-2."
