1 Title and commencement

- (1) This notice may be cited as the Customs Airports Examinations Stations Notice 1987.

The areas at the airports specified in the Schedule hereto are hereby appointed to be examination stations for the loading and unloading of goods and for the embarking and disembarking of passengers.

1 Auckland International Airport, Mangere

The hard standing area immediately adjacent to—

- (a) The pier of the international passenger terminal building:
- (b) The domestic terminal gates designated 21, 22, 23, 24, 25.

2 Whenuapai Airfield, Whenuapai

The hard standing area immediately adjacent to the air movements building at Whenuapai Airfield.

3 Christchurch International Airport, Harewood

- (a) The hard standing area immediately adjacent to the international wing of the passenger terminal building:
- (b) The hard standing area immediately adjacent to the international air cargo terminal building:
- (c) The area known as the Pits immediately adjacent to the Deep Freeze hangars.

4 Wellington International Airport, Rongotai

- (a) The hard standing area immediately adjacent to the international passenger terminal building:
- (b) The hard standing area known as the Western Apron.
