Cook Islands Stamp Demonetization Regulations 1949

(SR 1949/131)

Cook Islands Stamp Demonetization Regulations 1949: revoked, on 20 September 2007, by section 7(2) of the Cook Islands Amendment Act 2007 (2007 No 49).

PURSUANT to the Cook Islands Act 1915, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

These regulations may be cited as the Cook Islands Stamp Demonetization Regulations 1949.

These regulations shall be in force in the Island of Niue.

Note

These regulations are administered in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

Every instrument that is dated after the 31st day of December, 1949, and is stamped with any of the stamps referred to in the Schedule hereto, and every postal packet that is posted after that date and is so stamped, shall be deemed to be not duly stamped.

Every person who has in his possession any of the said stamps may at any any time within twelve months after the said date present the stamps at any post-office in the Cook Islands or at the General Post Office, Wellington, New Zealand, and there-upon the stamps shall be exchanged for current stamps of an equal face value.

Stamps of denominations 1d, 2 1/2d, and 6d bearing effigies of Their Majesties King George the Sixth and Queen Elizabeth and the words "New Zealand 12th May 1937", and overprinted with the words "Cook Is'ds".

Stamps of denominations 1d, 2 1/2d, and 6d, bearing effigies of Their Majesties King George the Sixth and Queen Elizabeth and the words "New Zealand 12th May 1937", and overprinted with the word "Niue".

Stamps of denomination 1s bearing the effigy of His Majesty King George the Fifth and the words "Cook Islands Postage & Revenue One Shilling".

4

Stamps of denomination 1s bearing the effigy of His Majesty King George the Fifth and the words "Cook Islands Postage & Revenue Niue One Shilling".
