Fisheries (Central Area Amateur Fishing) Amendment Regulations 2005:
revoked, on 1 February 2014, pursuant to regulation 161(1)(c) of the Fisheries
(Amateur Fishing) Regulations 2013 (SR 2013/482).

Pursuant to section 297 of the Fisheries Act 1996, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the advice and with the consent of the Executive Council, makes the following regulations.

1 Title

- (1) These regulations are the Fisheries (Central Area Amateur Fishing) Amendment Regulations 2005.

Note

These regulations are administered in the Ministry for Primary Industries.

- (2) In these regulations, the Fisheries (Central Area Amateur Fishing) Regulations 1986¹ are called “the principal regulations”.

2 Commencement

These regulations come into force on 1 October 2005.

3 New regulation 5C substituted

The principal regulations are amended by revoking regulation 5C, and substituting the following regulation:

“5C Set netting prohibited from Tirua Point to Pariokariwa Point

No person may use any set net in the waters lying within 4 nautical miles from the mean high-water mark that extends from Tirua Point (at approximately 38°23.22’S and 174°38.04’E); then following a line in a generally southerly direction by the mean high-water mark to the southernmost point of the north bank of the Awakino River (at approximately 38°39.88’S and 174°37.24’E); then in a straight line across the Awakino River to a point on the south bank of the Awakino River (at 38°39.92’S and 174°37.22’E); then following a line along the mean high-water mark to the southernmost point on the north bank of the Mokau River (at approximately 38°42.36’S and 174°37.03’E); then in a straight line across the Mokau River to a point on the south bank of the Mokau River (at 38°42.40’S and 174°37.01’E); then following a line along the mean high-water mark to the north bank of the Tongaporutu River (at 38°48.88’S and 174°35.23’E); then in a straight line across the Tongaporutu River to a point on the south bank of the Tongaporutu River (at 38°48.98’S and 174°35.23’E); then following a line along the mean high-water mark to Pariokariwa Point (at approximately 38°53.49’S and 174°30.35’E).”

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 October 2005, amend the Fisheries (Central Area Amateur Fishing) Regulations 1986 by replacing regulation 5C, which prohibits set netting from Tirua Point to Pariokariwa Point, to update the co-ordinates relating to that area.
