1 Title

This notice is the Fisheries (Notification of Tāngata Tiaki/Kaitiaki for Area/Rohe Moana of Te Rūnaka o Makaawhio) Notice 2019.

2 Commencement

This notice comes into force on 15 August 2019.

4 Customary food gathering area/rohe moana

This notice applies to the customary food gathering area/rohe moana defined by clause 2(c) of the Fisheries (South Island Customary Fishing) Notice (No. 5) 1998 (*Gazette* 1998, p 4061), which is an area from Piopiotahi (Milford Sound) to Abut Head on the west coast of the South Island.

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This notice is made under the Fisheries (South Island Customary Fishing) Regulations 1999 (the **regulations**). It comes into force on 15 August 2019 and revokes itself at the end of 8 October 2023.

The notice relates to a customary food gathering area/rohe moana of the tangata whenua represented by Te Rūnaka o Makaawhio. The area/rohe moana is an area from Piopiotahi (Milford Sound) to Abut Head on the west coast of the South Island.

Notice is given of the reappointment of 3 Tāngata Tiaki/Kaitiaki for the area/rohe moana. The Minister of Fisheries made the reappointments at the request of Te Rūnaka o Makaawhio.

The powers of Tangata Tiaki/Kaitiaki are set out in the regulations.

Notes

1 General
