Notice

1 Title

This notice is the Fisheries (Notification of Tāngata Tiaki/Kaitiaki for Mātaitai Reserve at Kaihoka Point and Anatori) Notice 2019.

2 Commencement

This notice comes into force on 20 December 2019.

3 Revocation of this notice

This notice is revoked at the end of 5 April 2024.

4 Mātaitai reserve

This notice applies to the mātaitai reserve at Kaihoka Point and Anatori, on the upper west coast of the South Island, that was declared by the Fisheries (Declaration and Notification of Kaihoka and Anatori Mātaitai Reserve and Appointment of Tangata Tiaki/Kaitiaki) Notice 2010 (*Gazette* 2010, p 4254).

5 Reappointment

- (1) The Minister of Fisheries has appointed Rima Piggott for a further term as a Tangata Tiaki/Kaitiaki for the mātaitai reserve.
- (2) The appointment—
 - (a) took effect on 6 April 2019; and
 - (b) expires at the end of 5 April 2024.

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This notice is made under the Fisheries (South Island Customary Fishing) Regulations 1999 (the **regulations**). It comes into force on 20 December 2019 and revokes itself at the end of 5 April 2024.

The notice relates to the mātaitai reserve at Kaihoka Point and Anatori, on the upper west coast of the South Island. The tangata whenua of the area that includes the mātaitai reserve are represented by Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Rārua.

Notice is given of the reappointment of a Tangata Tiaki/Kaitiaki for the mātaitai reserve. The Minister of Fisheries made the reappointment at the request of Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Rārua.

The powers of Tāngata Tiaki/Kaitiaki are set out in the regulations.

Notes

1 *General*

This is a consolidation of the Fisheries (Notification of Tāngata Tiaki/Kaitiaki for Mātaitai Reserve at Kaihoka Point and Anatori) Notice 2019 that incorporates the amendments made to the legislation so that it shows the law as at its stated date.

2 *Legal status*
