Medicines (Designated Prescriber: Optometrists) Amendment Regulations 2007: revoked, on 1 July 2014, pursuant to section 51(b) of the Medicines Amendment Act 2013 (2013 No 141).

**Preamble**

Pursuant to sections 105 and 105B of the Medicines Act 1981, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the advice and with the consent of the Executive Council, makes the following regulations.

These regulations are the Medicines (Designated Prescriber: Optometrists) Amendment Regulations 2007.
- 2 Commencement**  
These regulations come into force on 2 August 2007.

These regulations amend the Medicines (Designated Prescriber: Optometrists) Regulations 2005.

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### **Explanatory note**

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations, which amend the Medicines (Designated Prescriber: Optometrists) Regulations 2005 (the principal regulations), come into force on 2 August 2007.

These regulations substitute a new schedule of optometric medicines into the principal regulations. The new schedule is the same as the

current schedule except for the addition of prescription medicines, cyclopentolate and tropicamide.
