1 Title

This order is the Trade in Endangered Species Order 2005.

2 Commencement

This order comes into force on the 28th day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

3 New Schedules 1, 2, and 3 substituted in Trade in Endangered Species Act 1989

The Trade in Endangered Species Act 1989 is amended by revoking Schedules 1, 2, and 3, and substituting the schedules set out in the Schedule of this order.

4 Revocation

The Trade in Endangered Species Order 2003 (SR 2003/390) is revoked.

threatened, and exploited species set out in the schedules and amend some of the terminology to reflect more accurately the terminology used in the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora.

The order comes into force on the 28th day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.
