

**Order**

**1 Title**

This order is the Trade in Endangered Species Order 2019.

**2 Commencement**

- (1) Clause 5 comes into force on 28 August 2020.
- (2) The rest of this order comes into force on 9 January 2020.

**3 Meaning of Act**

In this order, **Act** means the Trade in Endangered Species Act 1989.

**4 Schedules 1, 2, and 3 of Act replaced**

Replace Schedules 1, 2, and 3 of the Act with the Schedules 1, 2, and 3 set out in the Schedule of this order.

**5 Schedules 2 and 3 of Act amended**

## **Explanatory note**

*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

This order updates the schedules of the Trade in Endangered Species Act 1989 (the **Act**) that list endangered, threatened, and exploited species. The changes align the schedules with changes that have been made to the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (the **Convention**).

Most of the changes come into force on 9 January 2020. Some threatened species of sea cucumbers and cedars are inserted into Schedule 2 of the Act on 28 August 2020. Some exploited species of West Indian cedar are removed from Schedule 3 of the Act on 28 August 2020. The timing of these changes depends on when the related changes to the Convention take effect.

This is a consolidation of the Trade in Endangered Species Order 2019 that incorporates the amendments made to the order so that it shows the law as at its stated date.
