An Ordinance to Provide for the Appropriation of the Sum of Title. £140,000 to be raised by the authority of the Debenture Ordinance, No. 1, 1863.

WHEREAS by the Debenture Ordinance, No. 1, 1863, such sums Preamble. money, not exceeding in the whole the sum of £140,000, as may be required for the construction of a Railway between the Bluff Harbour and Invercargill, in the Province of Southland, and certain Jetty works connected therewith, were upon the security and in the manner therein mentioned, authorised to be raised: And whereas it is expedient to provide for the appropriation of such sums so authorised to be raised as aforesaid:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Superintendent of the Province of Southland, with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof, as follows:—

Short Title.

1. The short title of this Ordinance shall be the "Appropriation Ordinance, No. 1, 1863."

Appropriation of sums to be raised under the Debenture Ordinance, No. 1, 1863.

2. Out of any moneys raised or to be raised by virtue of the said Ordinance, there may be issued and applied in manner hereinafter mentioned any sum not exceeding the sum of £140,000 to defray the expenses of the works following, that is to say—the construction of a Railway between the Bluff Harbour and the Town of Invercargill, and Jetty works connected therewith.

Provincial Treasurer to pay money in accordance with warrant

3. The Provincial Treasurer shall issue and pay from time to time any sum or sums of money for the purpose hereinbefore mentioned, not exceeding in the whole the said sum of £140,000, to by Superinten. such persons and in such proportions as the Superintendent, by any warrant to be signed by him, shall from time to time direct, and such Treasurer shall in his accounts be allowed credit for any sum of money paid by him in pursuance of any such warrant, and the receipt of the person to whom the same shall have been so paid shall be to him a full and valid discharge for the sum for which such receipt shall have been given, and the amount thereof shall be passed to his credit accordingly.
