

APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, NO. 2, 1863.

IN THE TWENTY-SEVENTH YEAR OF THE REIGN OF HER MAJESTY QUEEN VICTORIA.

"AN ORDINANCE to Provide for the Appropriation of the sum of Title. £110,000, to be raised by the authority of the Debentures Ordinance, No. 2, 1863."

THEREAS by the Debentures Ordinance, No. 2, 1863, such Preamble. sums of money, not exceeding in the whole the sum of £110,000, as may be required for the construction of a Railway between Invercargill and Winton, in the Province of Southland, were upon the security and in the manner therein mentioned, authorised to be raised: And whereas it is expedient to provide for the appropriation of such sums so authorised to be raised as aforesaid :

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Superintendent of the Province of Southland, with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof, as follows :----

1. The short title of this Ordinance shall be the "Appropria- Short Title. tion Ordinance, No. 2, 1863."

Provincial Treasurer to pay money in accordance with warrant by Superintendent.

2. Out of any moneys raised or to be raised by virtue of the under the Debentures said Ordinance, there may be issued and applied in manner herein-Ordinance, No. 2, after mentioned any sum not exceeding the sum of £110,000, to defray the expenses of the works following, that is to say :-- The construction of a Railway between the towns of Invercargill and Winton, in the Province of Southland.

> 3. The Provincial Treasurer shall issue and pay from time to time any sum or sums of money for the purpose hereinbefore mentioned, not exceeding in the whole the said sum of £110,000, to such persons and in such proportions as the Superintendent, by any warrant to be signed by him, shall from time to time direct, and such Treasurer shall in his accounts be allowed credit for any sum of money paid by him in pursuance of any such warrant, and the receipt of the person to whom the same shall have been so paid shall be to him a full and valid discharge for the sum for which such receipt shall have been given, and the amount thereof shall be passed to his credit accordingly.
