

## IMMIGRATION AND BRITISH AGENT ORDINANCE, 1861. No. 2.

IN THE TWENTY-FIFTH YEAR OF THE REIGN OF HER MAJESTY QUEEN VICTORIA.

An Ordinance for promoting Immigration to the Province of Title. Southland, and appointing Agents in Great Britain for that and other purposes.

WHEREAS it is expedient that provision should be made to en- Preamble. courage Immigration to the Province of Southland from other parts of the Empire, and out of the public funds of the Province to assist persons who may be unable to pay the whole cost of their passage thereto, and for the advancement of other interests of the Province:

Be it therefore enacted by the Superintendent of the said Province, with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof, as follows:-

- 1. The Short Title of this Ordinance shall be the "Immigration Short Title. and British Agent Ordinance, 1861."
- 2. An Agent or Agents in the United Kingdom for the Province Agenton Agents of Southland, shall be from time to time appointed by Ordinance of ed in Great the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the said Province, to Britain. promote Immigration to this Province, to protect in Great Britain the political and other interests of the said Province, and generally to carry into effect such instructions as may be given to him or them in pursuance of the provisions of this Ordinance.

3. The Superintendent, with advice and consent of the Executive may make and Council, shall make Regulations for the management of Immigra-regulations for tion, such arrangements with the Agent or Agents aforesaid as immigration, to be laid before may be necessary for conducting the same, and may alter or rescind Council.

such Regulations or arrangements, or any of them, and make others instead thereof; and all such Regulations or arrangements shall be laid before the Provincial Council, if sitting, or, if not then sitting, at the opening of the next session of the same.

Correspondence with Agent to be laid before Council.

4. All correspondence with the said Agent or Agents shall be conducted by the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council; and all communications from the Superintendent or from the said Agent or Agents shall be laid before the Provincial Council, if sitting, or, if not then sitting, at the opening of the next session of the same.

Agent may Province under Superintendent's structions.

5. It shall be lawful for the said Agent or Agents to enter into make contracts all such contracts, and generally do all such things on behalf of the said Province, and of the Government thereof, as he or they shall from time to time be authorised to enter into or do, by instructions under the hand of the Superintendent.

AgentorAgents may resign, and appoint others pro tem., subject to confirmation by Superintendent.

6. Any Agent or Agents as aforesaid may resign such office, and by writing under his hand or their hands appoint some fit person in his or their stead, and such person shall be Agent in the same manner as though he had been appointed by an Ordinance as hereinbefore required; Provided that every such appointment shall terminate twelve months after the date thereof, unless it shall be confirmed by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council.

And may employ Agents.

7. The said Agent or Agents may employ Agents under them Sub- for the purpose of promoting Immigration to the Province of Southland, or for any other purpose connected with the affairs of the said Province: Provided that in all such cases, such Agent or Agents shall act strictly in accordance with the instructions which shall be issued to them by the Superintendent.
