

MARINE BOARD ORDINANCE, 1862.

IN THE TWENTY-SIXTH YEAR OF THE REIGN OF HER MAJESTY QUEEN VICTORIA.

An Ordinance to constitute Marine Boards within the Province of Southland.

WHEREAS by the 33rd section of the "Marine Board Act, 1862," of the Preamble. General Assembly of New Zealand, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent and Provincial Council of any Province, by Act or Ordinance to be passed in that behalf before the 31st day of December in the year 1863, to constitute for any Port within such Province a Marine Board, and to distinguish each Board by such name as may seem fit, and to confer upon such Board any powers, duties, and functions, subject to the provisions of the said Act, and to give power to the Superintendent of the Province to define the limits of jurisdiction of any such Board within the Province: And whereas it is expedient to constitute a Board for the Ports in the Province of Southland;

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Superintendent of the Province of Southland, with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof, as follows:—

- 1. The Short Title of this Ordinance shall be the "Marine Boards Ordinance, Short Title. 1862."
- 2. There shall be constituted for the Ports in the said Province a Marine Marine Board Board, to be named the Southland Marine Board.

Ports in Southland to be constituted.

Powers o f Board.

3. Such Board shall have, exercise, and perform all such powers, duties, and functions as are mentioned and set forth in the 40th section of the said recited Act.

Board may fix. alter, and levy tells. &c. in respect of any Wharf.

4. Such Board shall also have power from time to time to fix and alter as occasion shall require, such tolls, dues, wharfages, in respect of any horses, cattle, vehicles, and persons passing or re-passing along any wharf or jetty in any Port in the said Province, and also in respect of any goods or merchandise landed on or carried along any such wharf or jetty; and also in respect of any ships or vessels lying alongside or fastening to any such wharf or jetty, and to direct the mode in which the same shall be paid and levied, as they shall think fit.

Superintendent diction of Board.

5. It shall be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of may define the Executive Council, by proclamation in the "Provincial Government Gazette," diction of to define the limits of the jurisdiction of the said Board, and such limits to revoke and alter as occasion shall require.
