An Ordinance to abate the Dog Nuisance.

Whereas an Ordinance was enacted by the Governor of New Zealand and the Legislative Council thereof in the third Session of the said Council intituled "An Ordinance to provide a Summary Mode of abating the Nuisance of Dogs wandering at large in Towns" and the said Ordinance being wholly inadequate to abate the said nuisance or to prevent the worrying and destruction of sheep and other live stock it is expedient to repeal the same and to make other provisions in lieu thereof BE it therefore enacted by the Superintendent of the Province of Taranaki with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof as follows:—

- 2. The Superintendent may appoint persons to be Registrars Superintendent of Dogs and assign to them respectively such districts as he Registrars of may think fit.
- 3. Every owner of a Dog or Dogs shall forthwith register Dogs to be the same with the Registrar of Dogs for the district in which Registered. he may reside There shall be a yearly registering of Dogs in the month of December and every owner of such shall be subject to the annual tax hereinafter provided.
- 4. For the registration of every Dog during the present Fees payable, month of December the sum of Twenty Shillings and yearly Badge. thereafter in the month of December the sum of Ten Shillings shall be paid to the Registrar who shall supply to each owner a Register Badge upon which the register number for the year shall be stamped and which Badge shall be attached to a collar to be worn upon the neck of the Dog so registered the register number to be determined by the Registrar of Dogs at the Town of New Plymouth.
- 5. Every Registrar shall enter in a book to be kept for the Book to be kept purpose the name address and calling of the owner the name by Registrar, and description of the Dog so registered with him the number of the Badge and the date of registration which book shall be open to inspection at each office during the usual hours on payment of a fee of Sixpence.
- 6. If any person shall falsely make or counterfeit or knowing ling in counterfeit the same to be false or counterfeit purchase use or have in his Badges. possession any Badge resembling the Badge provided under the 4th clause of this Ordinance he shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Ten Pounds nor less than Five Pounds.

Any person owning maintaining having charge of or Penalty for unhaving knowingly about his premises or in his following any Dog six months old unregistered shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five Pounds for every Dog so owned maintained or being in his charge or following Provided always that should any Dog have been registered between the months of June and November inclusive it shall not be necessary to register the
- 8. Any Dog or Dogs not having attached to a collar the Unregistered Badge for the current year shall be deemed unregistered and may be destroyed if found at large.

Dogs found nolesting or worrying live took may be lestroyed. 9. All registered or unregistered Dogs wheresoever found molesting or worrying cattle sheep pigs or other live stock whether such Dogs at the time at which they may be so found shall be or shall not be in charge of any person may be destroyed Provided that any person may use his Dogs for the purpose of driving off any animals found straying on land in his occupation.

Proof of damage,

10. In all cases where damages for injury done by a Dog are sought to be recovered from the owner it shall not be necessary for the plaintiff to prove that the owner knew of the Dog's propensity to commit the injury complained of but the defendant may bring evidence to show that he had no reason to believe that his Dog was likely to commit such injury and such evidence may go in mitigation of damages.

11. All fees accruing under this Ordinance shall be paid by the Registrar to the Provincial Treasurer of the Province for the time being.

12. All fees fines and penalties levied under this Ordinance shall be recoverable in summary way Provided that the provisions of this Ordinance shall not extend to travellers or drivers or others having charge of live stock whose visit to the Province shall be of a temporary character.

13. The Short Title of this Ordinance shall be the "Dog Nuisance Ordinance 1863."
