AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL THE "IRON SAND LEASE ORDINANCE, 1858," AND TO MAKE OTHER PROVISIONS IN LIEU THEREOF.

Title.

An Ordinance to repeal the "Iron Sand Lease Ordinance, 1858," and to make other provisions in lieu thereof.

Preamble.

WHEREAS by Deed of Grant bearing date the 20th day of August 1858 the unalienated lands within the Town site of New Plymouth are vested in the Superintendent under the provisions of "The Public Reserves Act 1854" upon certain trusts in the Grant described And whereas by Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of Taranaki intituled the "Iron Sand Lease Ordinance 1858" a lease of part of the said recited lands was executed by the Superintendent to Edward Morshead for a term of twenty-three years And whereas it is in the said lease provided that in case of the non-performance of certain conditions in the said lease expressed it should be lawful for the said Superintendent with the approval of the Provincial Council of the said Province to be expressed by a resolution of the same to enter upon the lands and premises thereby described and absolutely determine the said lease anything therein contained to the contrary notwithstanding

IRON SAND LEASE ORDINANCE.

And whereas in consequence of the forfeiture of the said lease by the said Edward Morshead the same was determined by the Superintendent and it is expedient to repeal the said recited Ordinance and to make other provision in lieu thereof Be it therefore enacted by the Superintendent of the Province of Taranaki with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof as follows :—

1. The said recited "Iron Sand Lease Ordinance 1858" shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

"Iron Sand Lease Ordinance, 1858," repealed.

2. It shall be lawful for the Superintendent by Deed signed by the said Superintendent and sealed with the Public Seal of the Province to execute a lease for a period of twenty-three years of the lands specified and described in the form of Lease in the Schedule hereto unto Charles Watt, Edward Keep, William Joseph Ecroyd, Henry Youngman, and Germain Nicholson, upon the terms and conditions in the said form expressed. *

Superintendent empowered to execute Lease for year of lands specified in Schedule.

3. And whereas by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of Taranaki intituled the "The Public Reserves Trust Ordinance 1861" it is enacted there shall be a Board of Trustees for the management of the lands then or that might thereafter be reserved as an endowment for Educational and other purposes And whereas it is expedient to except the lands described in the Schedule hereto (being part of the said Public Reserves) from the operation of the said recited Ordinance Be it therefore enacted.

Recital of "Public Reserves Trust Ordinance, 1861."

4. The lands described in the Schedule hereto shall for the purposes of this Ordinance be deemed to be exempted from the provisions of the "Public Reserves Trust Ordinance 1861."

Lands in Schedule excepted from operation of recited Ordinance.

5. The Short Title of this Ordinance shall be the "Iron Sand Lease Ordinance 1864."
