*An Ordinance to further amend the representation of the Province of Taranaki 1873.* Title.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of Taranaki entitled "The Provincial Council Ordinance 1873" it was enacted that the Provincial Council shall consist of fifteen members and whereas it is expedient to make provision for giving an additional member to the Patea District BE it therefore enacted by the Superintendent of Taranaki with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof as follows :—

1. The Provincial Council shall consist of sixteen members and the number of members to be elected for each district shall be as follows :— Preamble.
