AN ORDINANCE TO VEST CERTAIN EDUCATIONAL RESERVES IN THE PATEA EDUCATIONAL BOARD.

AN ORDINANCE to vest certain Educational Reserves in the Patea Educational Board.

WHEREAS by Deeds of Grant bearing date the first day of Preamble. May 1875 the lands specified in the Schedule hereto are vested in the Superintendent upon trust for educational purposes And whereas it is expedient that the said lands shall be vested in the Patea Board of Education BE it therefore enacted by the Superintendent of the Province of Taranaki with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof as follows :—

PATEA EDUCATIONAL RESERVES TRUST ORDINANCE.

Short Title 1. The short title of this Ordinance shall be "The Patea Educational Reserves Trust Ordinance 1875."

Trust transferred from Superintendent to Board. 2. From and after the passing of this Ordinance the lands specified in the Schedule hereto held upon trust by the Superintendent for educational purposes shall be transferred to be vested in and held by the Patea Educational Board for the like purposes.

Board may alienate lands by way of lease. 3. Subject to the provisions of the Acts of the General Assembly of New Zealand of which the short titles are respectively "The Public Reserves Act 1854" "The Taranaki Education Reserves Act 1871" and "The Taranaki Education Reserves Act Amendment Act 1873" the Patea Educational Board may by Deed duly executed alienate by way of lease for any period not exceeding 21 years and subject to such conditions as shall in such Deed be declared all or any of the lands specified in the Schedule hereto.

Application of rents and profits. 4. The rents profits and proceeds arising out of the said lands shall form part of the revenue of the said Board and shall be applied in such manner as the Board shall think fit in the promotion of education in the Patea Educational District subject however to the provisions of "The Taranaki Education Ordinance 1874."

Board to furnish return to Superintendent annually. 5. In the month of December in each year the Board shall forward to the Superintendent a return of the land dealt with under the provisions of this Ordinance and the revenue derived therefrom and such return shall be published by the Superintendent in the Government Gazette of the Province.
