WHEREAS by certain Ordinances of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Taranaki penalties have been imposed on persons in certain cases but no special provision has been therein made for the recovery of such penalties And whereas it is expedient that such penalties shall be recovered in a summary way BE it therefore enacted by the Superintendent of the Province of Taranaki with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof as follows:—

1. All fines penalties forfeitures or sums of money which under or by virtue of any Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Taranaki now or hereafter to be in force in the said Province are or shall be directed to be imposed on any person shall and may where no other form or mode of procedure is or shall be prescribed by such Ordinance for the recovery of the same be recovered in a summary way

Fines, penalties, &c., to be recovered in a summary way where not otherwise provided.

before any two Justices of the Peace in the manner provided by the "Justices of the Peace Act 1866" so far as the same relates to summary convictions or by any Act repealing or amending the same or for the like purposes.

Short Title. 2. The short Title of this Ordinance shall be the "Recovery of Penalties Ordinance 1869."
