## SALE OF LIQUORS RESTRICTION ORDINANCE, 1856.

## ANALYSIS.

Preamble. 1. Sale of Intoxicating Liquors between 12 o'clock

- on Saturday nights and 6 o'clock on Monday 4. Penalty on contravention. mornings prohibited.

AN ORDINANCE TO RESTRICT THE SALE ON SUNDAYS OF INTOXI- Title, CATING LIQUORS.

HEREAS it is expedient to restrict the Sale on Sundays of Preamble. Intoxicating Liquors.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Superintendent of the Province of New Plymouth, with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof, as follows:

- 1. No Person shall between the hours of twelve o'clock on Saturday nights and six o'clock on Monday mornings sell any fermented or spirituous liquor, or deliver upon sale any such liquor.
- 2. No Person now or at any time hereafter holding a License for the sale of fermented and spirituous liquors or for the sale of fermented liquors only, shall between the said hours supply or suffer any such Liquor to be drunk in any Licensed House occupied by him or its appurtenances.

Sale of Intoxicating Liquors between 12 o'clock on Saturday nightsand 6 o'clock on Monday mornings prohibited.

Publicans not to permit intoxicating liquors to be drunk on their premises between the said

Exception in favor of Travellers and Lodgers at Public extend to prohibit the sale or supply of any such liquor by any person now or at any time hereafter holding any such license as aforesaid to Travellers, or to Persons boarding and lodging in any House licensed for the sale of such liquor, or to prohibit the purchase of any such liquor from on board any vessel in the Roadstead of New Plymouth, or the sale of any such liquor for shipment on board any such vessel.

Penalty on confravention.

4. Any person contravening in any respect any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall for every such offence forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding twenty pounds.

Interpretation terms.

5. In the construction of this Ordinance the words "sell" and "sale" shall include barter and every other mode of disposal for valuable consideration. And no person resident within twenty miles of the Town of New Plymouth shall for the purposes of this Ordinance be deemed a traveller.

Commencement of operation.

6. This Ordinance shall come into operation on the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six.

Passed the Provincial Council the eighth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six.
