AN ORDINANCE TO EMPOWER THE SUPERINTENDENT IN CERTAIN CASES TO GRANT COMPENSATION OUT OF THE PUBLIC RESERVES IN THE TOWN OF NEW PLYMOUTH.

An Ordinance to empower the Superintendent in certain cases to Title. grant Compensation out of the Public Reserves in the Town of New Plymouth.

WHEREAS by deed of Grant bearing date the twentieth day of Preamble. August 1858 the unalienated lands within the Town site of New Plymouth are vested in the Superintendent under the provisions of "The Public Reserves Act 1854" upon certain Trusts in the Grant described And whereas it is expedient to alter the said Trusts so far as to enable the Superintendent to appropriate a part of the said lands to compensate persons whose lands lying within the said boundaries have been taken or injured for certain public purposes BE it therefore enacted by the Superintendent of the Province of Taranaki with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof as follows :--

- Claims when to be preferred under Ordinance Gazette and in the newspapers of the Province require all persons claiming Compensation in respect of land lying within the Town site of New Plymouth which has been taken wholly or in part for Military Reserves Native Reserves public thoroughfares or other purposes of public utility to deposit their claims in writing at the office of the Superintendent within thirty days from the date of such notice.
- To be compensated out of the Superintendent to appropriate to every person Public Reserves lawful for the Superintendent to appropriate to every person within the Town who shall have duly deposited his claim and substantiated the same to the satisfaction of the Superintendent section for section or such further or other portion of land being part of the said Public Reserves within the said boundaries as may to him appear equitable.

Upon the appropriation of any such section or portion of to accept full land to any person under the preceding clause such person shall surrender of lands claimed, and all docu-ments relating give to the Superintendent a full surrender of all rights or claims to the land so taken or occupied and in respect of which thereto, and to such appropriation has been made and all land orders documents give conveyances of lands and deeds relating to the same and thereupon it shall be appropriated by lawful for the Superintendent to give to every such person sation. an effectual conveyance of such section or portion of land so appropriated.
