An Ordinance to appropriate the revenue of the Provinceticle. of Westland for the year ending 31st December, 1875.

ANALYSIS

- 1. Title.
- 2. Short title.
- 3. Appropriation of Provincial Revenue for the year ending 31st December, 1875.
- 4. Provincial Treasurer shall issue and be allowed credit for the sums appropriated.

DE IT ENACTED by the Superintendent of the Province of Westland with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof as follows:—

- 1. The short title of this Ordinance shall be "The Appropriation short Title. Ordinance 1875."
- 2. Out of the Public Revenues of the said Province there may be Appropriation issued and applied in the manner hereinafter mentioned any sum or Revenue for sums of money not exceeding the several sums hereinafter specified the year endamounting in the whole to the sum of Sixty-Three Thousand Seven 1875.

Hundred and Thirty-four Pounds Eleven Shillings and Sevenpence for defraying the charge of the Government of the said Province for the year commencing on the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and seventy five and ending on the thirty first day of December one thousand eight hundred and seventy five that is to say for the service of the several departments in manner according to the several amounts specified and set forth in Schedules (A & B) to this Ordinance.

3. The Provincial Treasurer shall issue from time to time any sum or Treasurershall sums of money for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned not exceeding issue and be al- in the whole the sums respectively specified to such persons and in such portions as the Superintendent shall by any warrant under his hand from time to time direct and shall be allowed credit in his account for all such sums so paid by him in pursuance of such order and the receipts of the persons to whom such sums shall have been so paid shall be to them a full discharge for the sum or sums for which said receipts shall be given.
