## NORTHERN, WELLINGTON, CANTERBURY, AND OTAGO AND SOUTHLAND STAGE EMPLOYEES.—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern, Wellington, Canterbury, and Otago and Southland Industrial Districts.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of an application for amendment of the Northern, Wellington, Canterbury, and Otago and Southland Stage Employees' award, dated the 5th day of November, 1936, and recorded in 36 Book of Awards 954.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and upon application made by a party to the Northern, Wellington,

Canterbury, and Otago and Southland Stage Employees' award, dated the 5th day of November, 1936, and recorded in 36 Book of Awards 954, this Court doth hereby order as follows:—

- 1. That the said award shall be amended-
- (i) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 3 (Wages), and substituting therefor the following subclause:—
- "(a) The following shall be the minimum rates of wages payable to the undermentioned classes of workers:—

(ii) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 6 (Casual Labour at Rehearsals), and submitting therefor the following subclause:—

"(a) Casual labour at rehearsals shall be paid for at the following rates:—

Per Hour.

"From 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., not less than . . 2  $8\frac{1}{2}$  "From 6 p.m. to 11 p.m., not less than . . 3  $0\frac{1}{2}$ 

"From 11.30 p.m. to 9 a.m., not less than 3  $6\frac{2}{3}$ "

- 2. That, for the purpose of removing doubts as to the operation of the two general orders of the Court made under the Rates of Wages Emergency Regulations 1940, and dated the 9th August, 1940, and the 31st March, 1942, respectively, it is hereby declared that the amended rates of remuneration provided by this order shall be increased to the extent and in the manner set forth in the said two general orders of the Court.
- 3. That this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 7th day of September, 1945.
